## Week 10: Knowing the Truth

Read Matthew 7:15-20.

Our Intentions	<ul> <li>What is the false prophet trying to do?</li> <li>What is the opposite of being alert?</li> <li>What is easy about living that way?</li> </ul>
God's Idea	<ul> <li>What is the first thing that Jesus says to do?</li> <li>Read 1 Peter 5:8-10. How does this verse relate to Jesus's instruction?</li> <li>In verse 16, Jesus says, "by their fruit you will recognize them" - what does fruit have to do with true and false prophets? (fruit is the outcome of what is being grow; that's how you know what the seed was originally intended) - when you look at the fruit, you know the fruit</li> <li>Read Ephesians 5:8-13. What is good fruit? What is bad fruit?</li> <li>In order to produce good fruit, you have to know what is true.</li> <li>Read 1 Corinthians 14:33. What does this say about God's character?</li> </ul>
Social Media's Influence	<ul> <li>How is there deception or confusion on social media?</li> <li>How do we stay alert while using it?</li> </ul>
Kingdom Intersection	<ul> <li>Read John 15:1-11.</li> <li>What does it mean that you remain or abide in the Lord?</li> <li>What does this passage teach us about God?</li> <li>When we know God, we know what is true. When we know what is true, only then can we produce good fruit in our lives.</li> <li>Read Psalm 119:160. What does this teach us?</li> <li>Read John 14:6. What does it mean that Jesus is the truth?</li> </ul>
Implications for Us	<ul> <li>In Hebrews 6:19, the hope in Jesus is described as "an anchor for the soul, firm and secure." How is Jesus the anchor in a world of changing winds and waves?</li> <li>Read Philippians 4:8. How do we think on things that are true?</li> <li>What are truths that you need to remember about God and his character?</li> </ul>

**Heart of the Matter:** The heart of God is not to confuse or mislead you. Following God is not always easy, but He promises us to guide, bring things to light and promote truth.
