Read Matthew 6:1-4.

Our Intentions	<ul> <li>Reading verses 1-4 again, what are the human intentions displayed?</li> <li>In verse 2, the Greek word for honor means to magnify, glorify and celebrate.</li> <li>What is the significance of using trumpets?</li> <li>Why do we want others to see the good deeds we are doing?</li> </ul>
God's Idea	<ul> <li>What is Jesus's heart for those listening to what he is saying?</li> <li>Why does God desire secrecy in this way?</li> <li>Read 1 Thessalonians 4:11-12. What is the overlap between these verses and this section of Matthew?</li> <li>What does it mean for us to live a quiet life?</li> <li>How do we see God's idea for modeled in the life of Jesus?</li> </ul>
Social Media's Influence	<ul> <li>How do we see all of this connected to social media usage?</li> <li>How do we see the world captivated by their own glory?</li> <li>What do you often post about social media? Or look at on social media?</li> <li>What would it look like to shine the light of Christ on social media profiles?</li> </ul>
Kingdom Intersection	<ul> <li>Read John 8:12. Jesus is the only one worth of glory. We are called to carry his light and live out His love.</li> <li>Read Matthew 5:16. What is the contrast between light and trumpets?</li> <li>Read Psalm 16:2. What does this verse mean?</li> <li>How do we remind ourselves that God is the only one worth of glory?</li> <li>Read Jeremiah 9:23-24. How should these verses inform the way that we live?</li> </ul>
Implications for Us	<ul> <li>How can we be people that carry the light of Christ?</li> <li>How can we use social media to carry this light?</li> <li>In terms of social media, what sorts of posts are trumpet posts? How do these types of posts affect others? Do your posts bring light or do they bring trumpets?</li> <li>As it says in Jeremiah 9:23-24, how can we boast in our understanding of knowing God? How do we pursue this understanding of God each day?</li> </ul>

**Heart of the Matter:** God wants us to practice righteousness, but not in front of others. His desire is for us to live a life of servanthood and quiet humility. Let Jesus be the sustaining source of your light. His light in you is what brings the Kingdom of God.
